

Pansy



Orange PIPING

1. Outline the flower, curving your line in at 3 points to give the look of 3 petals.



Light Green PIPING

2. Outline one leaf.



Dark Green PIPING

3. Outline the other leaf.



Green PIPING

4. Pipe squiggly lines inside each leaf using the same color as the leaf's outline.



Orange FLOOD

5. Fill in the outline of the flower.
(Allow to dry for at least 3-4 hours or 20 minutes in a dehydrator)



Orange PIPING

6. Pipe an outline for the first petal. Start from the center and loop around, giving a jagged look to the outer edge.



Orange PIPING

7. Repeat for the other two petals.



Orange PIPING

8. Pipe squiggly lines inside each petal. This extra support helps prevent flood icing from cratering (i.e. sinking in the middle when it dries).



Light Green FLOOD

9. Fill in the lighter green leaf.

Pansy (cont.)



Orange FLOOD

10. Fill in one of the petals

(Allow icing to dry or form a hard crust)

Orange FLOOD

11. Fill in a second petal.



Dark Green FLOOD

12. Fill in the dark green leaf.



Orange FLOOD

13. Flood the final petal being careful not to let the icing overflow the outline and merge with adjacent petals

(Allow icing to dry completely)

Dark Purple PIPING

14. Starting from the center point, pipe a line outward on a petal. Loop the line around to form an elongated teardrop shape.



Dark Purple PIPING

15. Pipe 3 or 4 elongated teardrop outlines on each petal.



Dark Purple PIPING

16. Pipe dots in the center of each teardrop. This will help to prevent cratering.



Dark Purple PIPING

17. Pipe small dots along the edge of an outer petal, curving the dotted line inward toward the gap between each interior petal.



Dark Purple PIPING

18. Repeat for the two remaining outer petals.

Pansy (cont.)



Green PIPING

19. To add texture to your leaves, pipe a series of lines, dashes and dots in the contrasting shade of green.



Dark Purple FLOOD

20. Fill in each teardrop, using your scribe to pull icing into the narrow points.

(Allow icing to dry completely)



Black PIPING

21. Pipe small dots in the center of the flower. Only pipe dots on or next to other dots that have had a few seconds to dry.



Black PIPING

22. Continue piping dots until the center is completely black.



Varied Colors

23. Try making your second flower with a different color combination. You can make it similar to the above image or try your own color combos.
