

Potion Bottles



Food Marker

1. Use a food marker along with either your projector or paper templates to mark guides on your cookie.
(More details in the video)



Ivory PIPING

2. Outline the round lid of the tall bottle, the upper lip of the bottle and around the edge of the main section.



Ivory PIPING

3. Outline the top edge of the small cork and immediately fill in with the same piping icing.



Gray PIPING

4. Outline the tag.



Pale Yellow PIPING

5. Outline the interior potion section of the tall bottle.



Orange PIPING

6. Outline the bottom of the cork.



Pale Pink PIPING

7. Outline the upper lip of the small bottle as well as the main section of the bottle.



Mauve PIPING

8. Outline the interior potion section of the small bottle.



Ivory PIPING

9. Pipe a line along the left edge of the tall bottle. You'll pipe it directly over the existing line to create a higher barrier.
(the video may make this clearer)

Potion Bottles (cont.)



Varied Colors PIPING

10. Using colors that coordinate with each section, pipe crater-preventing squiggles in the small areas shown.



Mauve FLOOD

13. *We'll use wet-on-wet techniques to fill the bottle, so work quickly on the next steps*
Fill in the potion section of the small bottle.



Scribe Tool

16. Place your scribe in the center of each white oval and pull outward in 4 directions (left, right, up, down) to create starburst shapes.



Plum PIPING

11. Use your paper template as a guide to pipe a stem and leaves on the left side. Immediately fill each leaf with this same icing.



Pale Pink FLOOD

14. Pipe a few small bubbles in the still-wet icing.



Pale Pink FLOOD

17. Fill in the rest of the main section of this small bottle. Start flooding around the potion working your way out and up as you go.



Plum PIPING

12. Repeat the last step, this time on the right side of the bottles.



White FLOOD

15. Pipe two oval shapes in the wet mauve icing.



Mauve FLOOD

18. Pipe two shadow lines, as shown, in the wet pink icing.

Potion Bottles (cont.)



White FLOOD

19. In the still wet pink icing, pipe two ovals (for highlights) near the top left edge.



Ivory FLOOD

20. Fill in the upper lip of the tall bottle.



Pale Yellow FLOOD

21. Pipe a line in the middle of the wet ivory icing.



Gray FLOOD

22. Fill in the tag.



23. Allow your icing to dry or crust over.



Pale Yellow FLOOD

24. *We'll use wet-on-wet techniques to fill the bottle, so work quickly on the next steps*
Fill in the potion section of the tall bottle.



Ivory FLOOD

25. Pipe a few small bubbles in the wet yellow icing.



White FLOOD

26. Pipe three ovals in the wet yellow icing.



Scribe Tool

27. Place your scribe in the center of each white oval and pull outward in 4 directions (left, right, up, down) to create starburst shapes.

Potion Bottles (cont.)



Gold PIPING

28. Pipe a few lines and dots near the edges of the still-wet potion section.



Ivory FLOOD

29. Fill in the rest of the main section of this tall bottle. Start flooding around the potion working your way out and up as you go.



Pale Yellow FLOOD

30. Pipe a line and dot near the top right of the still-wet ivory icing.



White FLOOD

31. Pipe an oval (as a highlight) near the top left of the still-wet ivory icing.



Ivory FLOOD

32. Fill in the round cap of the tall bottle.



Pale Yellow FLOOD

33. Pipe a curved oval inside the right edge of the still-wet ivory icing.



White FLOOD

34. Pipe a curved oval inside the left edge of the still-wet ivory icing. (This may be easier to see on the video)



Orange and Ivory FLOOD

35. Fill the bottom of the cork with orange icing and quickly pipe three small dots in it with ivory flood icing.



36. Allow your icing to dry or crust over.

Potion Bottles (cont.)



Pale Pink & Mauve FLOOD

37. Fill in the upper lip of the small bottle with pink icing and immediately pipe a curved mauve shadow near the lower right edge.



38. Give your icing time to dry completely.



Plum PIPING

39. To create the string for your tag, pipe a small line to the right of the bottle and a longer line extending across the bottle to the tag.



White PIPING

40. Pipe several starbursts, sparkles and dots above the leaves, as shown



Black Food Pen

41. Write a label on your tag. It's very important that your icing is completely dry first.
NOTE: You may stop here if you don't wish to paint more details.

Copper, Gold, Ivory Gels
Fine Tip Brush & Small Round Brush

42. Paint fine lines along the right edge of each dot in the cork. Water down & add shadow to the cork top with your round brush.

Eggplant, Mauve, Maroon Gels
Fine Tip Brush & Small Round Brush

43. Paint fine lines along the right/lower edges of each shadow & highlight on the pink bottle. Water down & add shading under the rim and down the right side of the bottle with your round brush.

Gold Gel
Fine Tip Brush & Small Round Brush

44. Paint fine lines along the right/lower edges of each shadow & highlight on the lid & body of the tall bottle. Water down & add shading under the rims and down the right side of the bottle with your round brush.

EdibleArt White Paint OR White Gel
Fine Tip Brush

45. Paint decorative details like lines and dots along the edge of your tag.
